Boise Bible College and Puget Sound Christian College had similarities in their beginnings. Both had strong support from founding churches—BBC—First Christian Church at 18th and Eastman and PSCB—West Seattle Christian Church. The vision of each from the beginning was to equip ministers prepared to start and lead churches. They both have had professors with vision and integrity. Many of the great leaders of the past are retired and leaving us one by one. One of those strong leaders at PSCC for many years was **Conley Silsby**. A celebration service held in his honor on February 13th in Everett Washington was shared by a few hundred people that had been touched by his life. Conley was 102 at his death. He taught at Northwest Christian College in Eugene, Minnesota Bible College and Puget Sound Christian College. He was often in churches at evangelistic services and was an innovator in many ways. For a period of time, he would travel to Boise to preach on weekends, then go to Eugene to teach and return to teach classes in Seattle at the end of the week...this was all before freeways. Christian Higher Education misses the great preachers and professors of old, they wore big shoes and are missed. My question to you is, “Who will fill their shoes?” Boise Bible College is dedicated to the task of equipping ministers to be effective communicators filled with a passion to love in Jesus name. Will you help encourage young men and women to consider ministry? Conley and I once spent six weeks as roommates traveling around Asia with a Christian basketball team. That time inspired me in many ways to dream big and serve God for a lifetime. Will your legacy live on as Conley’s is living on in my life and that of many, many others?
