



20 HOUSING FAQs

AT BOISE BIBLE COLLEGE

1) Are single rooms available?

Yes, limited single rooms are available at an extra cost. See “Tuition Cost and Fees” under “Cost and Financial Aid”.

2) Is the meal plan required?

For on-campus students, the meal plan is required. However, under special circumstances, students can obtain approval to be removed by the Dean of Students.

3) Are there places for students to cook their own meals?

Yes, there is a full kitchen on-campus. The kitchen is located in the Gym Building in the Student Lounge.

4) Can students remove College furniture from their rooms they don't want/need it?

No.

5) Do students have to live in the dorms?

Full-time students under the age of 21 must live on campus unless living with parents.

6) How do new students get involved with activities on campus?

Jump right in! There are many activities to get involved in around campus. Attend chapel for announcements or check your student email for announcement sheets.

7) If a student does not get his or her preferred dorm, and/or roommate preferences, what can he or she do?

Talk to the Resident Director.

8) If a student does not have a roommate preference, what factors will be used to select a roommate?



The Resident Director makes housing arrangements based on factors such as if you like your room clean or messy and if you are a morning or night person. The Housing Application has these details.

9) What safety measures are in place for on-campus students?

- Dorm buildings remain locked at all times, but a key card to gain access is given to each student. In addition, each individual dorm room has a key code specific to the residents.
- EZ Text Alert System – All students are asked to provide information for the emergency text system “EZ Text” prior to each semester (incase information changed)

10) What happens if my roommate leaves?

If a roommate leaves, you might be assigned a new roommate or stay in the current dorm. However, the cost of the dorm does not change.

11) What if a student wants to make a room change?

Room changes can happen, but talk to the Resident Director.

12) What if I do not own a computer?

There is a computer lab located in the Library.

13) What is a student not allowed to bring to furnish the room?

Students are allowed to bring anything that fits. However, students are furnished with a bed, under bed storage, closet with space, desk, desk chair, bookshelf, cork board, and the common area has a small table and chairs.

Students are not allowed to use anything with open heating elements such as a toaster or heater.

14) What is an RA?

A RA or Resident Assistant helps assist the Resident Director in helping, encouraging, and guiding students towards successful on-campus living.

15) What size linens should I bring?

Size – twin, long



16) Are there laundry facilities? How much does it cost per load?

Each dorm, women and men, have their own laundry facility that is included in the Student Life fee each semester. Students must provide laundry detergent.

17) Is there an age limit to living in the dorms?

Yes, students older than 25 cannot live in the dorms unless under special circumstances.

18) Are women and men in separate dorms?

Yes.

19) Are there housing meetings or cleaning requirements?

Yes. There are monthly housing meetings and weekly room checks.

20) Do I need a mini-fridge?

Maybe. Talk with your potential roommates about buying one together or you can bring your own and stash it in your room.
